[Captain Charlton Hunt Tandy](#) (1836-1919) - abolitionist, Civil War veteran, activist, president of St. Louis Colored Relief Board, attorney, U.S. Marshal

[Dr. Charles Henry Turner, PhD](#) (1867-1923) - entomologist, scientist, St. Louis teacher

[Elizabeth Hobbes Keckley](#) (1818-1907) - seamstress, freedwoman, confidant to First Lady Mary Todd Lincoln, teacher

[Annie Turbo Pope Malone](#) (1869-1957) - chemist, inventor, businesswoman, benefactor to St. Louis Colored Orphans Home, now known as [Annie Malone Children's Home](#)

[Thomas Million John Turpin](#) (1871-1922) - composer, Father of St. Louis Ragtime, businessman, deputy constable

[Rev. Moses Dickson](#) (1804-1901) - abolitionist, barber, founder of [Knights of Liberty](#), Civil War Veteran, pastor, activist, Mason
